## Sirius-ly Speaking



Q: My dog is a 5 month old mixed breed I got from the Humane Society. He chews everything in the house especially my shoes. What can I do to stop him?

A: Chewing is a very normal, natural doggy behavior. Your puppy is not chewing things to annoy you but because it comes naturally to him. He explores his world through his mouth. If only he had opposable thumbs...He is also in the midst of losing his puppy teeth. His gums are inflamed and sore and

he may be looking for some relief from the discomfort. I would suggest that you not attempt to stop the behavior but to teach him that there are more appropriate things to chew.

Go to your local pet store and stock up on a variety of different chew toys. Get a variety of types and shapes. Play with him with his toys. Ask him to direct his attention to his toys before you will give him things he may want (for example meals, attention, or treats). Find chew things that will help with the discomfort of losing his puppy teeth. A nice chewy for sore gums is a frozen carrot.

Lastly, stash things that you do not want him to chew on while you are teaching him the appropriate things to chew. Put away things like shoes and other valuable items and secure dangerous things like cleaning products and small plastic children's toys. Keep him safely in an exercise pen when you cannot supervise him. Leave him a place to sleep, a pee pad, water and lots of toys .

By taking these positive steps, your puppy will learn what things he can chew and you and he will both be a lot happier.
