Legacy of Life Hawai'i is a nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization and is the only organization in Hawaii federally designated to recover organs and tissue for transplant.

Aaron Okubo received the "gift of life". In 2006, he was diagnosed with a failing liver. He was immediately placed on the transplant list, but unfortunately his condition deteriorated and he was rushed to emergency. For six weeks he remained in the hospital and eventually ended up in ICU as both his liver and kidneys began to fail. Thanks to the generosity of a donor family, he continues to thrive and is healthy. Aaron is one of many people in Hawaii, who was helped and given a second chance at life.

Reyhan Ma-Albertson holds a B.S. in Kinesiology and Rehabilitation from the University of Hawaii at Manoa. In 2008, Reyhan completed coursework from the Hawaii Massage Academy in Honolulu and became a licensed bodywork practitioner. She has completed levels 1, 2 & 3 of Healing Touch courses, and is on track to obtain the next two levels toward becoming a Healing Touch practitioner. Reyhan also has experience working as a personal trainer, Healthy Lifestyle Counselor and a physical therapy aide. Reyhan's passion lies in women's wellness, especially pre and postnatal care. She finds joy in providing specialized care for expectant mothers from postural muscle strengthening for back pain prevention, prenatal massage, stretch mark reduction, and other treatments based on traditional Malaysian methods.

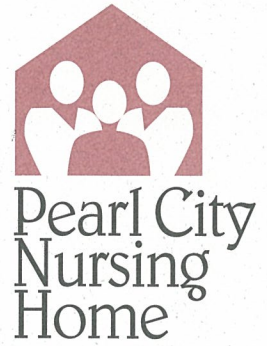
