President Sherilyn Tamayose called the board meeting to order at 5:50 p.m.

**Approval of Minutes:**

The minutes of the July 28, 2010 Board of Directors meeting were approved as published.

**Treasurer's Report:**

B/C/DP Account:	\$41,891.93

- President Sherilyn Tamayose thanked the 2009-2010 Board of Directors for their service this year.

**Committee Reports:**

**ASIST**

- President Sherilyn Tamayose reminded everyone that some of the ASIST winners will be participating in the International Women's Leadership Conference in September. Mary Eichholtz will be the contact for this function. She will follow up with Lenny Klompus on his commitment for a personal ASIST donation.

**Communications and Marketing**

- No report.

**EWISP**

- No report.

**Membership**

- There will be a membership drive as well as a firm night on Wednesday, September 8, 2010 at the Honolulu Country Club. Naomi Amuro distributed a list of 25 guests, including 19 prospective firms, who will be attending this meeting.

**Philanthropy**

- The next event: Reading Rally on Saturday, October 30, 2010 at the Kahala Mall center stage from 11:00a.m.-12 noon.

**Program**

- October 13 meeting: Installation of the new Board of Directors at 3660 on the Rise. Cost \$35.00 inclusive.

**Sergeant-at-Arms**

- There were 33 member representatives, 42 guests and 4 no shows at the July 14th membership meeting held at the Sheraton Waikiki Hotel.
- 73% member representative attendance compared to last year's 54%.

**Ways & Means**

- We had a very successful golf tournament on Friday, August 27th at the Hawaii Prince Golf Club.
- This year there were 105 teams compared to 144+ in previous years but we netted \$30,856.13.
- Brenda thanked the membership for their support and for those who volunteered this year.
- Thanks to the Hawaii Prince Golf Club who lowered the minimum from 144 to 120 golfers. We were given credit for 16 unfilled slots (equal to \$720) in the form of a gift card. This credit can be applied towards the next membership dinner expense or applied as a deposit if next year's W&M committee decides to hold a golf tournament.
- The Board approved the recommendation of the W&M's committee to divide the proceeds: \$24,000 to the B/C/DP account and \$6,856 to the General account.

**Unfinished Business:****Files Retention**

- President Sherilyn Tamayose announced the preliminary plans to go through approximately 13 boxes that are currently being stored at the Title Guaranty storage room basement. She will be asking for volunteers to assist reviewing the content of the boxes. Once this is done, we can determine if we need to self-store it or shred it.

**Ad-Hoc Committee Report**

- Valerie Tanaka and Lois Asato distributed the flyer and joint fundraising event agreement with Hawaii Literacy for the Wine Tasting event on November 10, 2010 at the Plaza Club.
- The goal is for EWI to sell 92 tickets for this event. Honolulu Chapter representatives will be asked to sell a minimum of two tickets each.
- The proceeds will be split 50/50 between Executive Women International-Honolulu Chapter and Hawaii Literacy.

**New Business:**

- Open Forum – President Sherilyn Tamayose and Brenda Kanno participated in the Open Forum conference call. Brenda highlighted some of the topics discussed: 1) taking out the full time requirement for member reps; 2) Corporate proposing one vote for all by-laws; 3) renewals by anniversary date; and 4) incorporation of Chapters.

## Academy of Leadership: The Alumni Experience

Mimi Donaldson, a motivational speaker from California, presented the Alumni session. She is an avid football fan, and therefore her message focused on using strategies from the game in our everyday work and personal life to get ahead.

The “Six M’s to the Hall of Fame” are:

- Know your Mission
- Motivate yourself
- Market yourself
- Manage your time
- Mentor: have some and be one
- Measure your results

One of Mimi’s goals in early 2006 was to attend the Pro Bowl in Hawaii in 2007 with one of her beloved nephews, who was also an avid football fan. She bought her airline tickets, took care of her hotel reservations, etc. At that time, she was still tending to a life-threatening disease. As the fall of 2006 approached, her doctors decided that she needed to undergo more aggressive treatments which required a series of hospitalizations for two weeks at a time. December rolled into January, and she was still in the hospital. She told her doctors that she was going to Hawaii, as planned and put up a sign in her hospital room: “February 8<sup>th</sup> to Hawaii.” Her doctors were skeptical, to say the least. Mimi was determined. She had a goal. Nothing was going to stop her from realizing that goal.

January 24 was a momentous day as she was discharged from the hospital. Can you imagine her exhilaration? She packed her bags and made it to Hawaii for the Pro Bowl! “The intention to get to a certain place makes you unstoppable.”

Mimi said football saved her. The rules of the game are easily translated to the rules of life. Through hard work, determination, and defined goals, anything is possible.

The Alumni attendees were taken on a tour of Hallmark Cards, which is headquartered in Kansas City, and were provided a history of the company’s evolution to the organization that it is today. The company, which was founded by the Hall brothers in 1910, is still a family-run business (celebrated its 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary earlier this year), and it is evident that they take very good care of their employees. Again, the theme of having defined goals was the lesson learned.

Some interesting facts about Hallmark include:

- 1984 = year Crayola was acquired by Hallmark
- 65,000 = number of different products they sell
- 100 = number of countries where you will find Hallmark products
- 40,000 = number of retail locations
- 700 = number of artists, writers, designers, etc., on staff
- 1925 = first year “Hallmark” name was used (prior to that it was Hall Bros.)

“When you care enough to send the very best” truly exemplifies the Hallmark mission of “helping us say it all.”

## Leadership Conference & Annual Meeting (LCAM)

September 23-25, 2010

Kansas City, MO

This year LCAM was held in the great city of Kansas City. Your delegates were yours truly, Sheri Tamayose (First Hawaiian Bank), Shelley Okubo (Aqua Resorts & Hotels), VP, President-elect, and Brenda Kanno (The Research Corporation of the University of Hawaii), Parliamentarian. There were 435 registered members in attendance in addition to the "A-Team" staff of Association Solutions who coordinated this event and invited special guests.

The experience at LCAM was wonderful! There were many connections with familiar chapter member reps and new introductions as well. Everyone shared many ideas of membership recruitment, retention, fundraising and more. This is what EWI is all about!

New at LCAM was the Expo which featured EWI chapters offering fundraising items for purchase such as cookbooks, EWI logo purse holders, and scarves. There were also many merchant vendors selling Miche bags/accessories, jewelry, skin products and more.

### **Tuesday, Sept. 21 - Presidents Caucus – "Back to Basics" (Shelley Okubo)**

This military themed Presidents Caucus began at 5 p.m. We were taken by tour buses to a former airport hangar, about 10 minutes from our hotel. There we were greeted by the 2009-2010 Corporate Board of Directors who each had between 6-7 "platoon" Chapter representatives on their team, grouped regionally. In my group, our reps were from San Diego, Pomona Valley, Phoenix, Tucson, Los Angeles and Albuquerque. Our platoon leader was Nancy Harrison from EWI Chattanooga. We bonded and shared ideas on various topics including EWISP, ASIST, recruitment and retention of member firms, and fundraising. After a delicious buffet, our assignment was to come up with a group name and group chant. Our name was "Band of Sisters." VP/President-Elect Sharon Bennett spoke about her goals for the chapters in 2010-2011 which included membership, technology in EWI, our literacy initiative and having a one-on-one relationship with the Corporate Board.

### **Wednesday, Sept. 22 – Presidents Caucus (Shelley Okubo)**

After a delicious breakfast, Lori Giovannoni from Lori Giovannoni and Associates (EWI of Salt Lake City) gave a heartfelt presentation on how we can better serve our membership, our chapters, and ourselves. Lori is an author of four books and public speaker who has spoken to over 250,000 people. She emphasized the importance of not only recruitment of new member firms but more importantly, retention of current member firms. One way to do that is to keep in contact with the membership and program committees to ensure good solid programs and continuing relationships with member firms. We were able to sit one-on-one with each member of the 2010-2011 corporate board and find out their goals and ask them questions pertinent to our individual chapters. I found this to be very beneficial.

### **Academy of Leadership, “Navigating the Lipstick Jungle”, speaker Jane McMurry (Sheri Tamayose)**

Ms. McMurry is an internationally recognized expert in broadcast media and an author. She gave the following tips on how to be effective leaders in the workplace:

- 1) Clarify goals. What matters most to you? Remember them and what is important.
- 2) Handle people and projects that take time. Take charge of your time.
- 3) Delegate efficiently.
- 4) Work efficiently. Learn to say, “No.” Use the “VIP” concept to prioritize your day—“V” vital things, “I” important, and “P” put off till later. Read, act, file or toss. Try to touch something only once. Get a “gopher” if necessary for small tasks.
- 5) Learn skills and tools to save time. Positive attitude.
- 6) Overcome procrastination

### **Academy of Leadership “Professional & Volunteer Leadership” (Shelley Okubo)**

Anna Liotta from EWI of Seattle, creator of Generationally Savvy™ Communications Solutions, was our speaker. She has over 15 years of experience in the field of inter-generational communications and leadership. She spoke about her experience with Pike’s Fish Market in Seattle and how they created an identity for themselves with the “Flying Fish” experience they are famously known for. We need to create a Membership ROI (return on investment):

- Be clear on your goals
- Explore the resources
- Stretch your comfort zone
- Share with your executive, colleagues and representatives
- Have generous listening

### **Reading Rally Luncheon**

The second grade students of Whittier Elementary School read in unison the story, “The Library Mouse” by Daniel Kirk to the delight of the audience. Three students who were recognized for their writing compositions skills by their schools read stories of their own. The students were hosted to lunch and each given backpacks which included school supplies, 4 books, and a \$25 gift card from Barnes & Noble. Whittier was also given 3,300 books as the result of a book drive effort sponsored by Mr. Goodscents & EWI of Kansas City. Additionally, the school received a LCD computer screen.

### **Career Tracks, “Handling Change”, “How We Sabotage Ourselves and How To Avoid It”, speaker Deborah Rinner (Sheri Tamayose and Shelley Okubo)**

Ms. Rinner is the Director of International Protocol and Corporate Etiquette Programs for Tero International. She shared the following 12 tips for helping people successfully navigate change:

- 1) Brainstorm creative, symbolic ways to prepare people for the upcoming change challenge.
- 2) Remove barriers to change, like fear.
- 3) Create a safe change environment by assuring people that they will not be embarrassed or punished for their learning-curve mistakes.
- 4) Your challenge will be to (a) make the message hit a relevant chord (answer the question: Why should I care?) and (b) be consistent and respectful enough in your messaging strategy that it will eventually sink in.
- 5) Communicate the problem underlying the need for change often and in a variety of ways.
- 6) Be prepared for a little resistance to the notion that it is time to change and learn new skills.
- 7) Give others responsibility for marshalling the change by assigning them to be “experts” of a given topic.

- 8) Make an effort to know others as people as well as employees.
- 9) Others will need to know where you stand in order to be assured that you stand for what you believe.
- 10) Practice, practice, practice! The brain needs lots of practice in order to form new connections.
- 11) Encourage others to evaluate their own change process.
- 12) Talk often about the importance of continuous improvement and set aside regular portions of staff meetings to solicit and talk about ideas for improving your processes and service.

### **Career Tracks, “Burnout to Bailout”, speaker Cathy Halloway Hill (Sheri Tamayose)**

Ms. Halloway Hill of EWI of Kentuckianna, is founder and CEO of C. Holloway Hill Enterprises, a personal and professional development organization specializing in technology consulting, training, and career/life coaching. She shared the following helpful advice on how to be successful and avoid burnout by “branding” yourself.

- You have tools needed to bail out—embrace change.
- You are “CEO” of “YOU.” Branding is all about mindset—What does it mean to you?

- **Why is Branding Important?**

Benefits:

- Differentiate yourself from others in a similar category
- Position yourself clearly in the mind of others
- Focus your message and your mission
- Create credibility
- Develop loyalty
- Establish a clear message for your audience/client/employer

Consequences:

- You lose yourself (contradicts your self-assessment work)
- Competitive labor market (layoffs producing tons of experts)
- You lose your motivation for accomplishing your goals
- No clarity on your message or audience
- No opportunity to expand and evolve into multiple streams of income

- **Three phases:**

- Attitude and mindset (develop)

Perform a thorough self-assessment—know who you are

What do you believe?

Determine your values

Discover your passions

Decide what you want to be known for

Determine your legacy

Write your eulogy

Create your plan

- Planning and organization (package)

Name, Business card, brand style (logo), speaking style, website and interviewing skills (resumes, job portfolio.)

- Communication and networking (communicate)

Network, Network, Network!

### **Annual Meeting (Sheri Tamayose and Shelley Okubo)**

The following Corporate By-Laws were passed:

**Removal of the February 15 Assessment Due Date.** The rationale for the change was by removing the date, this would allow Chapters the opportunity to offer 12 months of membership at all times during the year. By taking advantage of updated technology, this was a viable option for Chapters as it positions EWI on a competitive level with other similar organizations in the marketplace.

**Name and Geographic Boundaries.** The rationale for the change was the proposed insertion of language permits the Corporate Board to initiate discussions regarding existing Chapter boundaries that could open up possibilities for growth of the organization.

**Membership – Suspensions and Termination.** Due to additional concerns regarding the phrase “ or any other Membership” the phrase “...exclusive of a member firm...” will be proposed as an insertion in the sentence which reads “The Corporate Board may suspend the membership of a Chapter Satellite Chapter, or any other Membership, exclusive of a Member Firm on the following grounds...”

The following Chapter By-Laws were passed:

**Membership – Classes of Membership.** Replace proposed amendment to read “A sustaining member will be an individual who has been a Representative in good standing immediately prior to retirement from business or a Member Firm, and who is no longer employed **on a full-time basis** by any Member Firm or any other person or entity.”

A complete Corporate and Chapter By-Laws will be available to all representatives on the Corporate EWI website.

LCAM is always a top notch event! The experience is worthwhile because of the connections, education, and personal and professional growth this brings to you. You are able to witness on a larger scale the magnitude of EWI. We are amongst a great group of professionals and it is an event that every member rep should experience at least once in their career with our organization. Next year LCAM will be held in Minneapolis, MN, September 22-24, 2011! Thank you EWI of Honolulu for allowing us to attend this year!


